Directions:

from EAST or WEST: Massachusetts Turnpike (Rte. I-90) to exit 13, Rte. 30 East. The Park is on the right.

from MASS PIKE: Take Mass Turnpike (Rte. 1-90) to exit 13 to Rte 30 East. The Park is 1/2 mile down on the right.

From ROUTE 9: Follow Route 9 East or West to the Speen Street exit in Framingham. Go North on Speen St. Follow Speen Street for 1 mile until you come to Route 30. Turn right onto Route 30. The Park is 200 yards down on the right hand side.
